

## AGENDA ITEM 9.

### ADOPTED RULES AND AMENDMENTS

**Submitted for:** Action

**Summary:** This item reports on the agency's proposed omnibus rules and amendments, the text of which was published in the **Illinois Register** on February 17, 2006, and which was previously presented to the Commission as an information item at its January 27, 2006 meeting and an action item at its April 28, 2006 meeting.

Initial publication of the proposed rules and amendments triggered a 45-day public comment period that ended on April 3, 2006. At its April 28, 2006 meeting, the Commission accepted the proposed rules and amendments, following which the Executive Director authorized staff to initiate the second 45-day review period by submitting the proposed rules and amendments to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR), the legislative support services agency responsible for reviewing all rulemaking action of state agencies. ISAC's rulemaking is on the agenda for the June 13, 2006 meeting of JCAR.

While some technical changes have been made in response to JCAR staff suggestions and to conform to the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act, there have been no substantive changes from the rules and amendments as originally published. The anticipated effective date of these rules and amendments is July 1, 2006. The full text of the rules and amendments is provided under separate cover.

Following approval and adoption of these rules and amendments by the Commission, the Executive Director will authorize staff to submit them to the Administrative Code Division of the Secretary of State for publication as final adopted rules and amendments. Once adopted, they will be communicated to ISAC's clients through publication in the **Illinois Register** and various client communications, as well as being posted to ISAC's Web site.

**Action requested:** That the Commission approve the following resolution:

**“BE IT RESOLVED** that the Commission approves and adopts the omnibus rules and amendments, as modified during the rulemaking process, so that they can be effective for the 2006-2007 academic year.”
